
South Sudan: Humanitarian Funding Update, 15 September 2014




The humanitarian situation continued to deteriorate, with more than 1.8 million people displaced and 1.3 million people facing emergency levels of food insecurity. Partners are saving lives by


responding to the basic needs of the most vulnerable by providing food and livelihood support; and preventing the loss of a generation of children by addressing acute malnutrition and protecting those most exposed to violence, abuse and exploitation. A total of US\$1.8 billion is required for the Crisis Response Plan in 2014. As of 15 September, some \$838 million is still needed to provide assistance until the end of December 2014.

Pledges and commitments from the Oslo conference (\$ million)





The total amount of donor contributions for 2014 (CRP) as of 15 September, remains higher than for the CAP in 2012 and 2013. However, given the dramatic increase in the level of humanitarian needs, the requirement for this year continues to be proportionally less well funded than in the previous two years.
